Awards – Athletic Events: Official gold, silver and bronze medals will be presented to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place men and women finalists in each age category in each sport/event and presented at the Awards Luncheon on May 11.

SilverArts – Official ribbons will be awarded for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners in Heritage, Literary, and Visual Arts sub-categories.

SilverArts Follies – Official gold, silver and bronze medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place performing arts winners. Only “Best in Show” may advance to state finals.

A participant must compete and score in an event to be eligible for an award and to qualify for state finals.

INCLEMENT WEATHER – Game officials reserve the right to cancel or postpone events in case of inclement weather or unusual or extenuating circumstances. There will be no refunds for a canceled or postponed event. Come prepared for all types of weather.

STATE COMPETITION – The top three medalist winners in each athletic event, by gender and age group, are eligible to compete in State Finals this fall in Raleigh. First and second place Visual and Heritage Arts winners; first place Literary Arts; and Performing Arts “best in show” are eligible to continue at the state level.

NATIONAL COMPETITION – National Senior games are held every two years. Last year was a qualifying year for the event to be held June 22 – July 8, 2007 in Louisville, KY.
